Why volunteer?

Girls take what they do in guiding with them as they grow. Everything from working in a team, to taking the lead, to speaking out on issues they care about. It helps them develop the skills and confidence to become the young women they want to be and to make a difference to the world around them. As a volunteer, you can work with the girls in a range of roles – joining them on their journey. You will make your own memories whilst being part of theirs. And you never know, you might make friends for life too!

What roles can I do?

Whatever your skills and interests, whether it's volunteering with girls directly or supporting behind the scenes, there's a role to suit you.

Volunteer with girls at unit meetings

Unit meetings are usually once a week during term time. Each unit has a leader as well as unit helpers, who all contribute to the running of the unit meetings.

Use your skills

You may not be able to commit to working within a unit every week but that doesn't mean there isn't a role for you!

All of our units need help with administration, finances, social media and much more besides!

You may even have a specialist skill or knowledge that you can share with units in your local area you may be a historian, footballer, have circus skills...the possibilities are endless.

What happens next?

If you decide to register your interest, someone from your local volunteer team will be in touch. They'll be your main contact at the start and are there to support you and help you find the best role for you. They'll provide you with key contacts, information and resources.

If you plan to volunteer with girls, ask your local contact about going on taster visits to unit meetings. It's a great way to get an idea of how meetings are run, talk to other volunteers and pick up activity tips and ideas.
