Unit Helper

There's no responsibility for planning in this role but you'll be the extra pair of hands needed to make unit meetings happen.

Unit Finance

Managing unit finances involves overseeing all aspects of budgeting, accounting, and financial reporting to ensure proper handling of money. This includes tracking expenses and ensuring all financial transactions are accurately recorded. Regular financial reports, such as income statements and balance sheets, should be prepared to monitor the unit's financial health.

Unit Leader

As unit leader, you'll run the unit, lead a team of volunteers, and plan and deliver a programme of awesome activities.



You will help alongside the other unit leaders in running the unit. If you'd like to become a leader, you'll be supported to complete our leader development programme. You'll have training on everything from planning activities to child safety.

Unit Admin

The role of a unit administrator involves overseeing the operations of a unit, ensuring everything runs smoothly and efficiently.
